This means that each letter or symbol usually represents an entire syllable. There are thirty-three basic forms. These generally represent the consonants followed by the vowel α . The basic forms are altered in various ways to indicate a different vowel following the consonant base. The Amharic syllable is usually presented as a grid with vocals in the horizontal axis and consonants in the vertical axis. Below are the syllables in the most common Hu-HU order: You may notice that some consonants appear more than once in the alphabet, such as "H" appears four times. For these letters, every word has a "preferred" spelling. Many other consonants have a "glottalized" or "explosive" version indicated in the table with the "suffix".
